# Wildland Fire Courses 2019

## SUPPRESSION SKILLS

### I-100, L-180, S-130, S-134, S-190 BASIC FIRE SCHOOL

Dates: May 27-31, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$150

This course is designed to provide entry level wildland firefighter skills. The course will introduce factors affecting the start and spread of wildfire and recognition of potentially hazardous situations. Other topics to include situational awareness, basic communication responsibilities, the decision making process, and teamwork principles in the wildland fire environment. NOTE: Course to include field exercises requiring full wildland fire Personal Protective Equipment.

### S-131, FIREFIGHTER TYPE 1 S-133, LOOK UP, LOOK DOWN, LOOK AROUND

Dates: June 3-4, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$100

This course is designed to train for the positions of Incident Commander Type 5 (ICT5) and Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1). The course identifies environmental factors and indicators of hazardous fire conditions, and how to use these indicators when implementing the Risk Management Process. It contains several tactical decision games designed to facilitate learning the objectives and class discussion. Topics include fireline reference materials, communications, and tactical decision making.

### S-200 INITIAL ATTACK INCIDENT COMMANDER

Dates: June 3-4, 8a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

This course is designed to meet the training needs of the incident commander type 4 (ICT4). The six instructional units include Foundation Skills; Intelligence Gathering and Documentation; Size Up the Incident; Develop a Plan of Action; Post-fire Activities; Evaluating Incident Objectives and Manage the Incident.

### S-211 PORTABLE PUMPS & WATER USE

Dates: June 3-4, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

This course is designed to provide knowledge and skills to design, setup, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems. The focus is on portable pumps. Topics covered include: portable water delivery systems, equipment, roles and responsibilities, and system design and hydraulics. Field exercise included.

### S-212 WILDLAND FIRE CHAIN SAWS

Dates: June 5-7, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

The course lessons provide an introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chain saws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chain saw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to fireline situations. Students will be required to bring full wildland fire Personal Protective Equipment during the field exercise.

### S-215 FIRE OPERATIONS IN THE WILDLAND/URBAN INTERFACE

Dates: June 5-7, 8a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

This course is designed to assist structure and wildland firefighters who will be making tactical decisions when confronting wildland fire that threatens life, property, and improvements, in the wildland/urban interface.

### S-219 FIRING OPERATIONS

Dates: May 27-28, 8a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

The course introduces the roles and responsibilities of a firing boss (FIRB) and outlines duties of other personnel who may engage firing operations. The course discusses and illustrates common firing devices and techniques.

### S-270 BASIC AIR OPERATIONS

Dates: May 28-29, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

This course covers aircraft types and capabilities, aviation management and safety, tactical and logistical uses of aircraft, and requirements for helicopter take-off and landing areas.

### S-271 HELICOPTER CREWMEMBER

Dates: May 29-31, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(I.F. - CEI)  
Cost: \$130 (Noncredit)

This is a combined classroom/field course designed to provide student proficiency in all areas of the tactical and logistical use of helicopters. Topics include aviation safety, aircraft capabilities and limitations, aviation life support equipment, aviation mishap reporting, pre-flight checklist and briefing/debriefing, aviation transportation of hazardous materials, crash survival, helicopter operations, helicopter field exercise.

### S-390 INTRODUCTION TO WILDLAND FIRE BEHAVIOR CALCULATIONS

Dates: May 13-16, 8a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$150

This course is designed to introduce fire behavior calculations by manual methods using nomograms & the Fire Behavior Handbook Appendix B. The student gains an understanding of the determinants of fire behavior through studying inputs (weather, slope, fuels, and fuel moisture). The student also learns how to interpret fire behavior outputs, documentation processes, & fire behavior briefing components.



## INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM COURSES

### I-300 INTERMEDIATE INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM

Dates: May 6-8, 8a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$150

This course provides a greater description and detail of the Incident Command System (ICS) organization & operations.

### I-200 BASIC INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM

Dates: June 5-6, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130

This course introduces students to the principles of the Incident Command System (ICS) associated with incident-related performance. Topics include leadership and management, delegation of authority, management objectives, functional areas and positions, briefings, organizational flexibility, and transitions and transfers.

## LEADERSHIP COURSE

### L-280 FOLLOWERSHIP TO LEADERSHIP

Dates: May 30-31, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.  
(Idaho Falls - CEI)  
Cost: \$130 (Noncredit)

This training course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. The course combines one day of classroom instruction followed by a second day in the field with students working through a series of problem solving events in small teams. Topics include leadership values and principles, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team cohesion factors, ethical decisionmaking, and after action review techniques. Full wildland fire Personal Protective Equipment is required for the field exercise.
