A Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) is someone who has graduated from a state-approved school of nursing, passed the NCLEX-PN Examination (national licensing exam), and is licensed by a state board of nursing to provide patient care as an LPN. LPNs work in many diverse areas, both inside and outside of the hospital setting.

WHY CEI NURSING?


The CEI PN program is approved by the state of Idaho. Graduates from the PN program earn an Intermediate Technical Certificate (ITC) and are eligible to sit for the NCLEX-PN exam. Our first-time pass-rates for this exam are traditionally among the highest in Idaho and in the nation. Completion of this program and licensure as an LPN also allow the student who wishes to further their education to apply to CEI's PN-RN bridge program. This "bridge" program allows the graduate to earn their Associates of Applied Sciences in nursing, and enables them to be eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN exam. During the PN program, 2 courses (Nursing Pharmacology and Mental Health Nursing Principles) are taken at the RN level to facilitate the bridge program option without requiring those courses be retaken.

Our costs are low. With one of the lowest tuitions rates in Idaho, our program is not only proven to produce graduates with a high rate of NCLEX success, but at a reasonable cost.

Our faculty hold advanced degrees, and our small class sizes promote individual attention and encourage high levels of peer collaboration. Our realistic and state of the art skills and simulation labs support active learning in real world like situations. Our students obtain direct patient care through our many clinical partners.

THE CURRICULUM

The CEI PN (ITC) program is a 32-week program consisting of 2 semesters. The program requires full-time attendance, Monday through Friday (no classes are held in the summer). The successful student should expect to spend at least 40-60 hours per week in the program.

ADMISSION PROCESS

- Application deadlines for Spring semester start are October 1st at midnight.
- Application deadline for Fall semester start are March 1st at midnight.
- Applications are online. Student must be registered as a CEI student one month prior to the program application deadline (CEI application is free). Prior to program application, student must have:
 - a completed background check by Precheck (see CEI nursing website for process)
 - have either their CNA, EIRMC's Startech, or have taken CEI course "Introduction to Nursing" (anticipated start for this course Fall 2023)
 - Completed all pre-requisites (or in-progress if through CEI) with at least a C+ and prerequisite GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - Recommendation letter
 - TEAS/ACT/SAT scores
 - Physical Form
 - Immunization record.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Admission into the nursing program is currently noncompetitive. Qualified applicants are accepted as they apply after processing. This means qualified applicants are accepted on a "first qualified that apply, first accepted" basis.
- Each cohort (admission cycle) has space for 30 students.
- Acceptance to the program is conditional upon completing all prerequisites with at least a C+, passing a random drug screen, and attendance at a nursing orientation.
- Accepted students must complete program required immunizations and maintain compliance with immunizations throughout the program.
- All students in the nursing program must achieve at least a C+ in every course in the program.
- Students are responsible for providing their own transportation to clinical sites.
- Candidates should understand that this is a rigorous program. Dedication, professionalism, and strong organizational skills are required for success.
